Summer Term 2023 Year 4

As mathematicians we will:

- Continue to work on decimals, focusing on tenths and hundredths using concrete and pictorial representations to support our understanding.

- Consolidate our understanding of pounds and pence, and be introduced to decimal notation for the first time.

- Learn to convert between analogue and digital times.

- Study properties of shape by developing an understanding of obtuse and acute angles.

As geographers we will:

Learn about the formation an features of a river. We will follow its journey to the sea and discover the role of the water cycle.

We will find out about the importance of rivers in settlements, travel and farming. We will investigate bridges, irrigation an the industrial use of rivers. We will consider what happens as a river reaches the coast and the importance of estuaries for wildlife.

As readers and writers we will:

-Develop our reading and writing skills with daily lessons and practise, alongside regular guided reading, spelling, grammar and handwriting sessions.

-Write for a range of different purposes by studying a wide and varied range of exciting and engaging texts, including:

- Explanation texts using 'Until I Met Dudley' by Roger McGough

- Setting description through 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner - Poetry using 'A River' by Marc Martin

As artists and designers we will:

- Talk about artwork that uses textiles

- Explore and discuss different types of textile artwork -Explore how some textiles can have meaning or tell a story

-Learn to weave using a Loom, Warp String and Weft

As scientists we will:

-This term, Year 4 will be learning about sound. Specifically, how it travels and how sounds are made. They will explore pitch, volume and vibrations and identify patterns through scientific exploration.

After half term, we will delve into the discoveries of influential scientists and inventors linked to the topics covered this year. We will explore their key contributions and influence on our lives.
